### **One Family – the work of Tear Fund in Cambodia**

Red ants and snails. As diet ingredients go, these two are unlikely to find favour even among the most fad-obsessed Hollywood star.

But when hunger gripped Mol and Tol Tuch and their children in Cambodia, these were the options left available to them.

Why?

Climate change has disrupted rainfall patterns, causing bad rice harvests and food shortages. Tol's frustration is evident: 'When I cannot feed my children properly I get very disappointed, as I am their mother and I cannot feed them.' But no more. Their local church, empowered by a Tearfund partner, has met their food needs head-on.

Tearfund's partner, the Wholistic Development Organisation (WDO), works in the most rural and deprived parts of Cambodia.

When WDO staff came to Mol's village, they found people in poverty who were regularly facing hunger and being forced to adopt some desperate measures, such as eating insects, to survive. The locals were also isolated and without help.

Mobilising and working with the local church and the entire community, WDO started practical schemes to empower people by introducing new crops and livestock such as chickens and pigs to boost income, providing agricultural training and creating a community rice bank.

Mol said, 'The Christians loan me chickens to breed and sell. When we lack food we go to the church rice bank. When I have money I give it to my children for school.'

By overcoming hunger and showing the compassion of Jesus in the process, WDO and the local church have made more than just a physical impact on Mol and Tol's village - many residents have become Christians.

It's a story that WDO has repeated across Cambodia, reaching 18,000 people over the last three years, working in partnership with local churches to bring material and spiritual transformation.

The financial and prayer support of churches across the UK and Ireland is enabling WDO to bring real transformation to people living in tough and testing conditions.

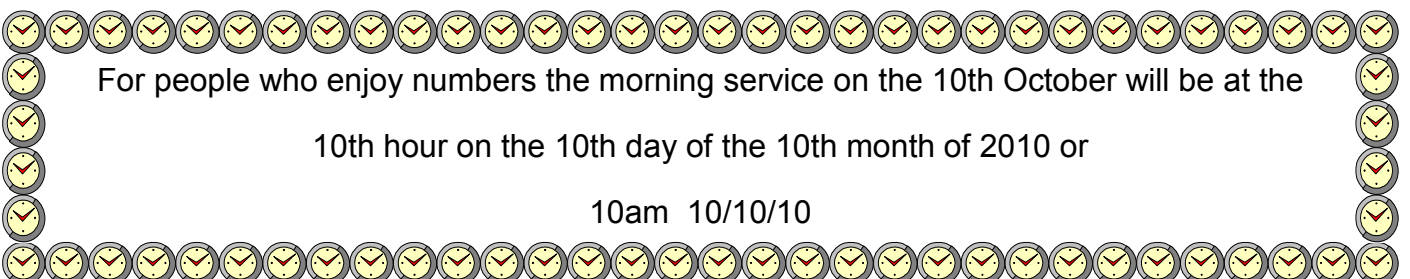
